**Kamaeni Hiba Hinoki Falsecypress**  
*Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Kamaeni Hiba'*

Height: 4 feet

Spread: 4 feet

**Description:**

Spectacular gold and green sprays of foliage grow in fanlike sprays that are threaded and pendulous with maturity; with a rounded habit, it is a perfect choice for containers, or as a rock garden accent

**Ornamental Features**

Kamaeni Hiba Hinoki Falsecypress has dark green foliage which emerges gold in spring. The scale-like leaves remain dark green throughout the winter. Neither the flowers nor the fruit are ornamentally significant.

**Landscape Attributes**

Kamaeni Hiba Hinoki Falsecypress is a dense multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a more or less rounded form. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This is a relatively low maintenance shrub. When pruning is necessary, it is recommended to only trim back the new growth of the current season, other than to remove any dieback. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Kamaeni Hiba Hinoki Falsecypress is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Accent
- Hedges/Screening
- General Garden Use

**Planting & Growing**

Kamaeni Hiba Hinoki Falsecypress will grow to be about 4 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 4 feet. It has a low canopy. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 70 years or more.

This shrub does best in full sun to partial shade. It prefers to grow in average to moist conditions, and shouldn't be allowed to dry out. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments, and will benefit from being planted in a relatively sheltered location. Consider applying a thick mulch around the root zone in winter to protect it in exposed locations or colder microclimates. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.
