Description:

This variety produces tall stalks and green foliage with dainty yellow flowers and seed pods; stalks and stems are edible, this selection is mainly grown for the seeds which have a strong spicy profile; flavorful seeds are great in stews and curries

Edible Qualities

Moonshine Black Mustard is an annual vegetable plant that is typically grown for its edible qualities. The entire above-ground parts of the plant are edible, and are typically harvested when mature. The edible parts have a spicy taste and a crunchy texture.

The plant is most often used in the following ways:

- Cooking

Planting & Growing

Moonshine Black Mustard will grow to be about 32 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 12 inches. When planted in rows, individual plants should be spaced approximately 6 inches apart. This fast-growing vegetable plant is an annual, which means that it will grow for one season in your garden and then die after producing a crop.

It may require supplemental watering during periods of drought or extended heat. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.
