### **Description:**

A densely branched variety with a small, compact habit; small deep green foliage feature rosy pink centers and variegation with white spots; drought tolerant and low maintenance, ideal for shady beds, borders, containers and hanging baskets

#### **Features & Attributes**

Jurassic Jr. Berry Swirl Begonia's attractive twisted heart-shaped leaves remain dark green in color with showy rose variegation throughout the year on a plant with an upright spreading habit of growth.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with an upright spreading habit of growth. This plant usually looks its best without pruning, although it will tolerate pruning.

### **Planting & Growing**

When grown indoors, Jurassic Jr. Berry Swirl Begonia can be expected to grow to be about 16 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 18 inches. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 3 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It requires an evenly moist well-drained soil for optimal growth, but will suffer if left to grow in standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
