A beautiful mounding and trailing selection, ideal for hanging baskets and combination planters; violet-purple double flowers with scarlet sepals dangle from bushy green foliage; adaptable as a houseplant; low maintenance-no deadheading required

Features & Attributes

Windchimes Basket Double Dark Eyes Fuchsia features showy nodding double purple frilly flowers with violet overtones and scarlet calyces at the ends of the branches from late spring to mid fall, which emerge from distinctive salmon flower buds. Its pointy leaves remain green in color throughout the year.

This is a multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with a mounded form. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Windchimes Basket Double Dark Eyes Fuchsia can be expected to grow to be about 12 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 24 inches. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 8 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It will benefit from a regular feeding with a general-purpose fertilizer with every second or third watering. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.

There are many factors that will affect the ultimate height, spread and overall performance of a plant when grown indoors; among them, the size of the pot it's growing in, the amount of light it receives, watering frequency, the pruning regimen and repotting schedule. Use the information described here as a guideline only; individual performance can and will vary.
